Fall Sports Recap

Soccer

Playing under new coach and Sedalia native Warren Dey, the Gremlin boys soccer team finished the season with a 12-11-2 record. Competing in Class 2, the Gremlins faced several tough opponents this season, especially in the district tournament. Sacred Heart finished second in both the Kaysinger Conference Tournament and the Kaysinger Conference. The Gremlins will have several returning starters next season.

Junior High soccer ended the season with an 8-3-1 record. Highlights included a Kaysinger championship title.



Golf

Girls golf experienced a rebuilding year, bringing back one golfer from its 2020 Class 1 State Championship team. Coached by Carla Lucchesi, the team of four worked hard during the season to improve individual scores. It was an enjoyable season full of continued growth and perseverance.



Cross Country

Cross Country had a strong start with its inaugural season. The team consisted of three dedicated runners who competed in six meets. Individuals medaled at the Clinton Invitational, Calvary Lutheran, and Kaysinger Conference meets.



Volleyball

Coached by Marlo (Boots) Siron '91, Sacred Heart Volleyball rostered the largest team in a decade. The Gremlins took 2nd place in a very competitive Class 1 District 14 tournament and finished the season ranked 9th in Missouri with a 22-9-1 record. Junior High volleyball finished with a 2-6 record.

In district play, two of the opponents were state-ranked. Sacred Heart beat #3 Concordia in the district semi-finals in three sets to advance to the finals against #1 state-ranked Santa Fe. A few highlights of the season included a third-place finish in the Warrensburg tournament, where the competition was Class 3 and 4 teams.



Football

Sacred Heart/Northwest Co-op 8-man football took the field with several state-ranked teams. The team battled to a 6-5 record this season and made it to the quarterfinals. Junior High football struggled for a win this season but showed immense growth as players and as a team. They will bring outstanding contributions at the varsity level.

Sacred Heart's art students took home several individual awards at the Kaysinger Conference art contest. The team was also one of four winners in the Optical Illusion Group Activity, which utilized chalk and tape to fool the eye.



Every year, as part of the Armor of God for Discipleship program, each grade level receives a prayer or devotional in the context of worship. Seventh-grade students each received a Bible during Mass celebrated by Fr. Dave Veit. The presentation took place on the Feast of St. Jerome, a Bible Scholar who wrote multiple commentaries on the scriptures. He also translated the Bible into Latin, the translation known as the Vulgate.

Rather than a traditional sales fundraiser, this "work-to-earn" opportunity generated \$14,750 toward the school's operating budget. Ms. Mariela Messina and the 7th-grade Science class visited Jacob's Cave in Versailles, Missouri. As part of the curriculum, they were able to see rocks and minerals from Missouri and learn the history of the cave.

Mrs. Hegger's 5th grade Math class used a triple beam balance to measure masses of various objects in grams to the nearest tenth, which takes a steady hand and concentration!



Mrs. Hagebusch's 6th grade Science class continued their discussion of invertebrates with the Phylum Echinodermata. They learned the definition ("spiny skin") and then put their hands on one to feel the spines.

Charitable hearts and a competitive drive to win the spirit stick helped SHS give its largest food donation in the history of the school's Thanksgiving food drive. "Cases, not cans" was the challenge, and students in grades K-12 responded. Student leaders, faculty, and parents delivered a total of 10,828 pounds (that's over five tons!) of food to Open Door Ministries. That beats last year's record of 7,272 pounds. All food stays local to support our neighbors in need. The big picture and the big winner is our community.



Second graders had the opportunity to visit Retrieving Freedom in Sedalia, which trains dogs to help veterans and children with autism. The students watched Dusty, a dog in training, work with a veteran. Dusty showed the students how he picks up items off the floor, such as car keys, a credit card, and a spoon. Students were also able to visit Libby and see where she lives when she isn't at school with Ms. Newkirk as part of the School Foster Program.

Did you know you can support St. Vincent de Paul Parish and Sacred Heart School whenever you shop with Scrip? Shop like you normally do, but pay with gift cards purchased through the program for everything from groceries to gas to clothing to vacations to home improvement. In past years the Scrip program has generated approximately \$19,000 in rebates to benefit our parish and school!



How does this happen? Each time you purchase a gift card through Scrip, the parish receives a rebate for a percentage of the card's face value. For example, when you buy a \$25 Old Navy gift card through Scrip, Old Navy gives the parish a donation for 14% of the value. You pay \$25, and Old Navy gives the parish \$3.50! It really adds up! Over 700 retailers participate and offer rebates ranging from 1.25 – 15% and more! There's even a smartphone app to make it super easy.

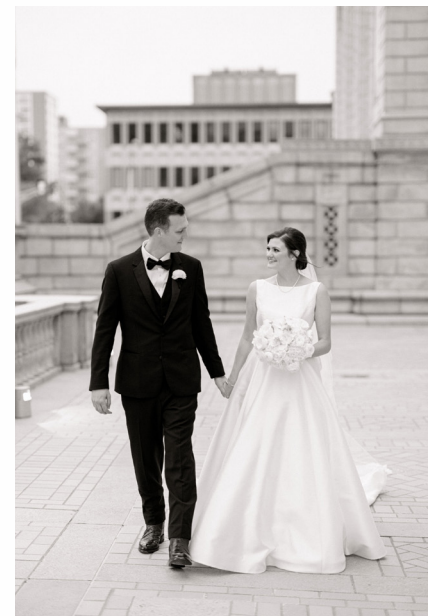

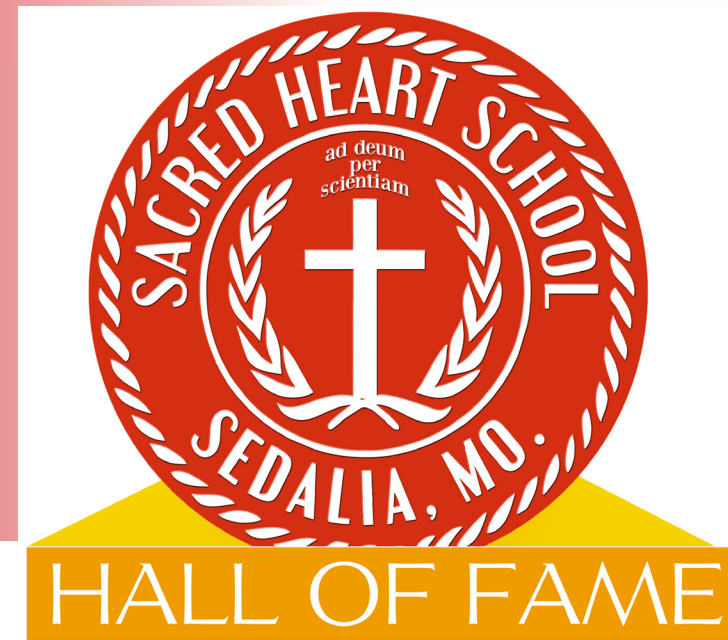

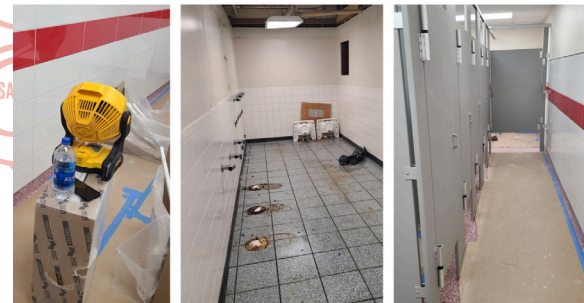
At the heart of our school are our educators, administrators, pastors, staff, and students. We thank you! Keep up the great work!

Solid Gold SHS honors Mrs. Turner

Teachers hold a special place in our hearts. Those who have inspired and have helped shape character (and in this case, a sentence or two) will forever be remembered by their students. Mrs. Marcia Turner is no exception. After 40 years of teaching at Sacred Heart School, Mrs. Turner retired in May 2021.

Mrs. Turner loves horses, pugs, chocolate, and Sacred Heart. While we wish her all the best in her retirement, the door is always open should she wish to come out of retirement (again)! In the meantime, Marcia shared some memorable moments from her time at SHS.

What drew you to teach at Sacred Heart?

I came to Sacred Heart in an unusual way. After our daughter Mollie was born, I wanted to stay home and be with her, but I also wanted to continue teaching. The school where I was teaching wasn't open to a part-time position, so I resigned effective at the end of the year. A couple of weeks later, Paul Barsi (the then principal of SH) called and asked if I would be interested in teaching part-time. Of course, I was! Thus began my tenure at this wonderful school. I remained part-time until our son DG went to kindergarten.



What kept you at Sacred Heart?

I was so happy with my wonderful students and their families and my colleagues. SH truly is a special place. I retired in 2014, thinking that I had done it long enough. I returned part-time when Mrs. Holly Walker and Dr. Gary Manning (the then administrators) asked. I found that I missed my kids and my colleagues very much, and part-time with Advanced English classes for juniors and seniors was the perfect solution.

Favorite traditions?

Having a school tradition centered around family is not common in schools. Sacred Heart certainly exemplifies what family is all about. The support I received in 2003 when our son DG was ill is so very dear to me. We traveled back and forth to Nebraska for eight months and always behind me was the caring and support of this wonderful family.



What is your biggest writing pet peeve?

Ending a sentence with a preposition. My students all know my reply when they misuse "can." I also detest the misuse of pronouns. I'll spare readers my English lecture!



Tell us about the tea outing. What inspired that tradition?

Tea began when I was teaching my 7th and 8th-grade girls' literature class. They were reading my favorite novel *Rebecca* and asked what "tea" was, so I explained how it worked in England. Well, they thought that sounded like fun. Maple Leaf Tea Room and then Shady Gables in Versailles were gracious (albeit, hesitant at first,) hosts. When my schedule and classes changed, thus began the tradition of both the girls and the boys going to tea every spring.



Favorite memories?

I would run out of ink recalling all of them. My classes were filled with extraordinary kids. The support and friendship with the parents was always exceptional. A couple of memories that come to mind involve my boys' golf team. At that time (early 1990's) I was the only female coach of a varsity boys team in Missouri. We had many laughs, especially when they made fun of my driving. A flash dance took place in the cafeteria by my 8th grade Honors English class (Class of 2015). We danced to "We Built This City" and they were fabulous! I also love Homecoming Week. The runway fashion show on "Switch Day" featuring my boys in government class was unforgettable. I also enjoyed having students impersonate me for spirit day. My favorite was when two seniors from the Class of 2021 dressed as Ms. McMullin and me!



In your years at SHS, has anything notable stayed the same?

The underlying purpose and success of the school remain the same. SH is truly a community. I believe that it's not only because we are a small school, it is also because of the standard and morals that are taught.



What is a book everyone should read?

Rebecca, *The Winds of War*, and *War and Remembrance*. Although those books are historical novels, they are historically accurate and give such insight into the political and cultural history of families whose lives become intertwined by events beyond their control.



Tell us about the international travels. How did they get started?

Our trips to Europe began in 1996. Jane McMullin and I had tossed around that idea several times when she said "we're doing it" to me. So off we went to London and Paris. Of course, we fell in love with travel and continued doing it every other year, ending in 2015. Again, there are too many memories to recount, but I will always be grateful for the terrific experience and times we had with our fellow travelers. I certainly know that everyone enjoyed my renditions of *On the Road Again* over the bus's intercom. Just because I can't sing, doesn't mean I won't!



Favorite place to visit and why?

My favorite is, and always will be, Paris. Italy and Spain would be a very close second, but everywhere we have been is absolutely fabulous.



Any words of Wisdom?

Staff: Keep those friendships and help each other. We're all in it together.
Students: Make the most out of every day you have at SH.
Alumni: Keep being the extraordinary people you are.
Parents: Thank you, thank you, thank you for sending your beloved children to us and for your support over the years.

Anything else you'd like to add?

I cannot tell the Sacred Heart family how grateful I am to have been a small part of it for all those years. The friendships, the treasured memories, the experiences--laughter and tears--will always be a treasured part of my life. We shared so much together. We were always there for each other and invaluable. Thank you Sacred Heart for having me. Thanks for the memories!
